Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

This Sunday begins Catholic Schools week, and starts with an open house of our school, and concludes with our annual auction. First, the Open House...

This Sunday morning (10AM-1PM), our school welcomes visitors into our building. The school is open to <u>anyone</u> who would like to tour the structure that houses our largest ministry on campus. Walk the halls, see improvements we've made in recent years, talk to teachers and parents, and have a doughnut and coffee.

Next Saturday concludes our week with the Annual STM Auction, held in Flanagan Hall. Tickets are still available for the evening, which includes a silent auction, live auction, and dinner provided by Garozzo's. In addition, our Fund-a-Need this year works toward completing our carpet replacement throughout the school, and integrating our phone system among the buildings on campus. The investment is pricey - a \$200K goal to complete both projects - but we already have 13% of our goal met, a week out from the auction.

This Sunday is also the last weekend of our "Art for Prayer" experience, being presented at the 11AM Mass. Over five dozen parishioners have already participated in this experience, and I am hopeful we will have a good showing for our last weekend.

Praying with imagery is a powerful (and often under-utilized tool) available to a Christian. We can each begin the new year with a new approach to the Lord's efforts to speak to us.

#### How Do I Check Out a Print for the Week?

Volunteers will be in the Narthex at the select weekend Mass and will take down your name and contact info. That's it! You'll receive a reminder late in the week to return the work at the end of the week.

#### How Might I Pray With The Work?

1. Set the painting in a place where you can comfortably gaze upon it.

2. Ask the Lord to reveal: "Why was I led to this particular work?" Give yourself ample time. Linger....

Over 75 prints of James Tissot, depicting Jesus and his ministry, are part of the public domain and are on display in the Narthex during the weekends of January. Each weekend parishioners from a particular Mass are invited to peruse the art show and borrow a work for the week and pray with it in their own home!

Each work is 10 inches by 14 inches, in a light-weight frame, labeled, and easy to transport.

3. Be mindful of what arises within as you spend time with the image. Memories? Feelings? Particular People?

4. Resist judging your "success or failure" in this experience, and instead keep inviting: "Lord, reveal what You want me to see, know, feel and recognize."

5. Conclude your time of prayer by thanking God for this time with Him, and for the ways in which Jesus continues to minister us.

#### What Then?

1. Return to the image throughout the week to see if new insights and revelations occur. 2. Share with others your experience and how the Lord spoke to you through the work. Did

you receive a consolation or assurance? Was the Lord inviting you to take a step in an unexpected way? Were there memories, relationships or events that the image brought to your mind and, if so, how was Jesus using those to minister to you?

3. If inclined, share with us at STM! Send an email to STMart@stmkc.com and tell us about your experience. (You can remain anonymous if you wish!) We'll post shared experiences with the community.

4. Make sure to return the work at the end of the week so more parishioners can benefit from it!
