




Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

When promoting environmental awareness, we can-

not overlook the use of our car. More and more people use car pooling or car sharing services, and that is quite amazing. Subscribers to this community service have access to cars. Although they have to pay each time they use one of the cars, it is much cheaper, on an annual basis, to subscribe to this service.

Users do not have to pay insurance premiums since these costs are shared by all users, and they don't have to pay for repairs. It has been clearly demonstrated that people who subscribe to such car-sharing services reduce greenhouse gases by approximately 50%. 
