

The Saint Junipero Serra Route will begin on May 19 with 11am Mass at the Cathedral in San Francisco, CA. This route will pass through the Archdiocese of KC, KS and the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph at the end of June. Stops along the way include the Golden Gate Bridge, Sacramento River, Rocky Mountains, Benedictine College and St. Louis before arriving in Indianapolis. February Neighbors in Need Report

In February, STM helped six families with rent and utility bills through our Neighbors in Need program, totaling \$2,738.40 in assistance. Another twoparent family of two young children was unable to pay their gas bill despite keeping the heat at 63 degrees because of the increase in the utility charges and due to employment difficulties.


