



Good Friday March 29



Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

This is Father Christian's last week with us before he returns to his pastorate in St. Joseph. It cannot be stressed enough what a God-send his arrival was to assist me in the sacramental offerings of the parish. Please join me in expressing appreciation for his five months with us that were as renewing for me as I hope they were for him.

With Father Christian's departure, our Masses retrench some until new assistance arrives, hopefully this summer. Beginning with Easter, there will be no Monday or Friday 6:15am Masses, and Saturday morning Confession/Mass (7:15/8:15AM) are limited to First Saturdays only.

Please join me this Holy Week in our many liturgical offerings, including the Saturday Easter Vigil (8PM) where we will welcome new Catholics in the celebration of the sacraments. To note:

- + There are no morning Masses Thursday through Saturday, as we celebrate the Triduum services in the evenings.
- + Holy Thursday will be the last day of scheduled confessions (5-6PM) ahead of Easter. There will be no scheduled confessions on Holy Saturday.
- + The Divine Mercy Novena begins this Friday (Good Friday). The novena can be found on page 7 of this bulletin.
- + Good Friday is also a day of fasting (one full meal for the day) and abstinence (no meat) as we align ourselves for intentionally with Jesus' passion.

#### **Holy Week at STM**

As we prepare for Holy Week, the Church undergoes a number of signs to awaken our senses. Among them:

- Votive Candles Removed Unlit votive candles from the Saint Joseph and Saint Mary devotional area have been removed. The remaining candles will be allowed to burn down ahead of the Triduum. A fresh batch of devotional candles will be back in place beginning on Easter.
- **Statuary is Covered** This veiling anticipates the pall of sorrow that falls upon the faithful as our Savior nears his passion. Statues are covered until the Easter Vigil.
- Tabernacle is Emptied Ahead of Holy Thursday, the tabernacle will remain empty and open, with no lit tabernacle candle. The tabernacle will remain empty until the end of the the Easter Vigil. (Availability of the Eucharist shifts during Holy Week. Visits to the homebound might need to be adjusted.)
- Holy Water Fonts Emptied Ahead of Holy Thursday, the holy water fonts remain dry, to be refilled at the Easter Vigil.

**Year of Prayer** 

After the year dedicated to reflection on the documents and the study of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council in 2023, Pope Francis has asked that 2024 be marked as a Year of Prayer in preparation for the 2025 Jubilee. This is not a Year marked with particular initiatives; rather, it's a privileged time in which to rediscover the value of prayer, the need for daily prayer in the Christian life; a time to discover how to pray, and above all how to educate the people of today in prayer, in this age of digital culture, so that prayer can be effective and fruitful.

## Divine Mercy Novena begins Good Friday (March 29, 2024)

## To prepare for the Feast of Divine Mercy,

the Lord asked Saint Faustina to make a novena (nine days) of prayer from Good Friday to the following Saturday. Jesus said, "By this novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary, 796). Jesus instructed Saint Faustina to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and bring to His Heart a different group of souls each day that He dictated to her. Jesus said: "I desire that during these nine days, you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death. On each day you will bring to My heart a different group of souls, and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy" (Diary, 1209).

#### Note:

Posters, holy cards, pamphlets, etc. for Divine Mercy may be found in the narthex.

## Instructions for the Novena (Diary, 1209)

**STEP 1:** Read the intention for the day, listed below.

**STEP 2:** Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy for the intention.

#### Intentions

DAY 1: Today, bring to Me all mankind, especially all sinners.

DAY 2: Today, bring to Me the souls of priests and religious.

DAY 3: Today, bring to Me all devout and faithful souls.

DAY 4: Today, bring to Me the pagans (those who do not believe in God) and those who do not yet know Me.

**DAY 5:** Today, bring to Me the souls of heretics and schismatics (the souls of those who have separated themselves from My Church).

**DAY 6:** Today, bring to Me the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children.

**DAY 7:** Today, bring to Me the souls who especially venerate and glorify My mercy.

DAY 8: Today, bring to Me the souls who are in the prison of Purgatory.

DAY 9: Today, bring to Me the souls who have become lukewarm.

## How to Dray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy

**BEGIN** with one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Apostle's Creed.

#### **OPTIONAL OPENING PRAYERS**

- "You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us" (Diary, 1319).
- "O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!" (Diary, 84).

ON THE OUR FATHER BEADS, PRAY: "Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world" (Diary, 475).

ON THE HAIL MARY BEADS, PRAY: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world" (Diary, 475).

AFTER FIVE DECADES, pray the concluding doxology three times: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

**OPTIONAL CLOSING PRAYER:** Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion--inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is love and mercy itself.

## **Holy Week Schedule**

#### Palm Sunday Weekend, March 23-24
