

Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

Congratulations to the eleven individuals who celebrated Sacraments of Initiation at last weekend's Easter Vigil. (See page 7 for names and photos.)

This week we celebrated our Kindergarten Round-up, welcoming the kindergartners who will join us in the Fall. **As of last week, Preschool, PreK, Kindergarten and 3rd grade all have waiting lists.** At this time last year, we had 372 students enrolled for the fall. As of this week, we again have 372 enrolled for next year.

Next Sunday is First Communion Sunday at STM. We will celebrate First Communion for our SOR and Homeschool families at the 11AM Mass, and a 2PM Mass for our STM School families. Because of our celebrations, there will be no Eucharistic Exposition in the Church next weekend.

A reminder that in four weeks, the dioceses on both sides of State Line will gather together for "Behold!", a gathering of the Church at the Liberty Memorial, on the 80th anniversary of Kansas City's first Eucharistic Congress. Vigil Masses in the city are canceled that evening (including STM), so no 4PM Mass on Saturday, May 4th. I hope many of you can join both bishops, dozens of clergy (including me), musicians from across the region, and the faithful from multiple parishes throughout the area. Green Team Tip of the Week

Better fabric softener for our world and your health: Use wool dryer balls and skip the added chemicals! Laundry dries faster (25% less time and less energy!) so be sure not to over-dry your clothes, that can cause static cling. Two medium-sized loads will dry faster and more efficiently than one gigantic load.

The National Center for Biotechnology Information reports that the perfumes and additives in laundry products may cause skin problems. Fabric softeners are allergenic and can cause eczema, which appears as dry, itchy skin.

Dryer sheets contain fragrance and volatile organic

compounds like acetaldehyde and butane, which can cause respiratory irritation. Fabric softener chemicals known as quaternary ammonium compounds have been linked to asthma. Acetone, also used in dryer sheets, can cause nervous system effects like headaches or dizziness.

Statement of the Missouri Catholic Conference on the Abortion Initiative Petition

The Catholic Church supports and defends society's most vulnerable, especially women and children, through accompaniment, social services, and material assistance.

A misleading proposed amendment to the Missouri Constitution suggests that a "right to an abortion" is needed to protect women, while the amendment could actually put women at risk and endanger preborn children. This ballot initiative would legalize abortions in this state and remove long standing health and safety standards for women. In addition, this initiative does nothing to reduce or eliminate the underlying social causes for abortion and does not further a true culture of life in the state.

Groups are currently collecting citizen signatures to add the amendment to the November 2024 ballot. We encourage all Catholics and people of good will to not sign any petition that would put this amendment on the ballot.

The Catholic Church in Missouri will continue to provide spiritual and material support to expectant mothers and their families through our parishes and ministries, and to advocate on their behalf and on behalf of their preborn children. For those women suffering from the pain of an abortion, the Church will continue to offer true healing and hope through its Post Abortive Healing Ministries. We ask all to help us in these efforts to safeguard the right to life.

We look forward to the day when every child, born and unborn, has the love and support needed to thrive and reach his or her full potential. Let us pray for a greater recognition of the gift of each and every human life in our society.
