World Day of Prayer for Vocations: April 21

We honor consecrated men and women who offer their lives to the Lord through prayer and apostolic activity, serving those around them.

We think of mothers and fathers shaping their lives through love, commitment to their children, and growth in maturity. We recognize those who work cooperatively for the common good, striving to build a more just world and a more humane society.

To young people, especially those uncertain about the Church, Pope Francis encourages exploration. Let Jesus draw you to Himself, read the Gospels, and let Him challenge you. Jesus respects our freedom; He proposes rather than imposes. Make room for Him, find happiness by following Him, and give yourself completely if He asks it of you.


