



Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

STM School completed its academic year this week, and entered their summer hiatus. Our teachers have a few more days of professional development and clean up of their classrooms, and we hope that they, alongside our students, find much renewal in the coming months.

I want to note the passing of Bernice Rosewicz, the 97-year-old mother of our principal, Linda Crosthwait. Her death on Pentecost is bittersweet for the family, and we pray that the Holy Spirit - the gift of consolation - truly comforts Bernice's family as they commend her to God.

Last weekend we welcomed our summer seminarian, Dan Stump, and announced the arrival in July of a Parochial Vicar (Associate Pastor): Father Pius Wesonga, AJ. Father Wesonga is a member of the Apostles of Jesus, a religious order founded in 1968, and whose priests will be serving in the diocese beginning this summer.

As we celebrate Memorial Day Weekend, a reminder that our hope for all of the faithful departed rests in ONE man, whose memorial we have been expressly asked to hold in His name. It is Jesus' sacrifice that has forged a pathway to heaven, and in Him where humanity and divinity find reconciliation. It is only in His name that any of us are saved. May we continue to commend to God ourselves and the faithful departed, through our Sunday sharing of Jesus' Memorial: the Eucharist.

Refugee Resettlement Report

STM parishioners set up an apartment Saturday, May 11 for a refugee family to move in on Tuesday the 14th. Our family was originally from Afghanistan. They have been living in a refugee camp in Qatar since they fled Afghanistan in 2021 with the fall of Kabul after our troops were removed. They were flown to Qatar so they could go through the vetting process which would allow them to be resettled in a country that would be open to accepting them. The family includes a mom and dad, 3 daughters (15, 14 and 6) and a son (10).

The Della Lamb case manager said they were thrilled with their new home which we set up for them. Even better, they were reunited with the dad's brother (after 3 years of being apart) who lives here in Kansas City! (Della Lamb has been formally resettling refugees in KC since 2014, but has provided services to KC's refugee population for decades.)

Help Feed the Homeless!

Uplift is an organization that runs on pure volunteerism. They deliver care and compassion to the homeless in KC. Pope Francis challenges us that one day we will be asked to answer to God for our efforts to care for the poor. He is not ambiguous in his encouragement to feed the hungry!

We at STM have a unique way to accept this challenge; the need has never been greater! 5 Ways to Keep Plastics Out of National Parks

As vacation season is upon us, the National Parks Conservation Association offers five simple tips to help keep single-use plastics out of the parks. (Of course, you can apply these practices wherever you roam!)

- Bring your refillable water bottle and reusable shopping bag. Rather than buy single-use plastics, purchase a refillable water bottle and take advantage of the refillable water bottle stations found in many national parks. The same goes for shopping bags.
- Support the National Park Service and concessioners' work to protect the places you love. As the NPS and its vendors work to achieve plastic-free parks, choose their new earth-friendly products and encourage businesses outside parks to model this ingenuity.
- Recycle the plastics you do use. Always dispose of waste properly. Parks often have recycling bins in place alongside trash bins.
- **Skip the straw.** Using a straw is often a reflexive act, something we are simply accustomed to doing without thinking about it. Dare to sip your drink without one, even if a server or check-out attendant offers it.
- Join clean-up efforts. Parks often host clean-up days that need volunteer help. It's a great way to get outdoors and meet other park enthusiasts while removing trash and plastic waste from park landscapes and waterways that otherwise may harm wildlife and spoil the visitor experience.




