



Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

We are a just over a week away from the beginning of our STM School year! See pages 6-7 for updates on projects and events we have going on.

Among those: a new roof on the school due to hail damage. In addition, our parish office deck took a wallop during a recent late night storm, and we had it removed after insurance adjustors examined the loss.

This Thursday is a Holy Day of Obligation: The Assumption of Blessed Virgin Mary. Mass times will be at 6:15AM, 8:15AM and 6PM. Our usual 5PM Confessions will still be available as well.

Lastly, a note about next weekend's second collection for Diocesan Life & Justice. These funds are distributed as grant dollars to ministries operating throughout the diocese who promote the defense of life and issues concerning justice. Last year, **STM's donations provided 5% of all grant dollars** distributed; not insignificant with over 90 communities collecting funds. STM Financial Report Available

Both the report from our just-concluded fiscal year, as well as the budget for 2024-25, have been submitted to the diocese and are available to parishioners on our website, stmkc.com. See "Annual Report." Ignoring the sale of Saint Catherine's - which left us with a sizeable amount we have placed on deposit with the diocese - we ended the year with expenses exceeding income. That difference, though, is attributed to the HVAC replacements throughout campus this year.

- Submit to a background check.
- Commit to the policy on Ethics & Integrity in Ministry (EIM).
- Attend an in-person Protecting God's Children training (PGC).
- Complete an online Mandated Reporter training and submit a certificate of completion to Joan Sandford or Tracy Stewart for that training.


