#### Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

As we continue our Christmas celebrations this weekend, and our school and parish employees take some well-deserved downtime, we still have developments happening during the break:

+ Our replacement of old carpet in the school part of last year's, fully funded, Fund-a-Need project - continues this Christmas break. New carpet is being installed for the classroom of one of our specials teachers, and three kindergarten rooms.

+ Judy Kashka, who has been helping our parishioners plan funerals and weddings for over a decade at STM, hands off the ministry this week to Jylian Hudson. I am so grateful for Judy's dedication to this ministry that asks the Church to walk with people during critical moments in their life. She has been a compassionate and steady walking partner to these parties, and our parish is the better for her offering. Her talents will be missed. I am also thankful that Jylian - a parishioner here with her husband and four children - has accepted these responsibilities. Jylian's background in music therapy and ministry as a cantor are great foundations for this ministry.

+ Father Pius leaves this Thursday to visit family in Uganda. Father Pius is usually only able to return home every other year, so to make the most of the occasion, he will be gone for several weeks. While Father Pius is away, I've cobbled together a number of different priests to come in on occasion to help me with the sacramental demands of the parish. Please be ever-gracious to these men who have their own responsibilities and parishes, and are lending me a hand into February.

+ Our Children's Liturgy of the Word offerings are expanding to twice a month, beginning next weekend. At the 9AM Mass on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month, the youngest parishioners are invited to leave Mass with several catechists, who break open the Gospel in an age-appropriate way. This ministry is only possible through the generosity of volunteers, and the robust response from parents with young children participating.

+ Our Sacrament of Confirmation preparation sessions begin in January. As noted earlier, the

diocese is moving the Confirmation age to 6th grade, so for the next two years we will be running parallel preparation programs for 6th graders and 8th graders. Affected STM School families have already been preparing, but if you or someone you know is in the 6th or 8th grade and in a public school or homeschool environment, and would like to celebrate the sacrament this June, please contact Hayley Shaver in the parish office.

Your Faith in Focus

Feast of the Holy Family, Year C

#### LOVE THEM BACK TO CHRIST

#### What do I do when someone I love walks away from God?

One of the great pains in life is when family members walk away from the Church. What do we do when that happens? Here are four straightforward ideas that Fr. Mike Schmitz offers. As he says, these ideas are not magical solutions, but they can help us daily in doing what we can for our loved ones.

#### 1. Keep communication lines open.

In our divided culture, this is vitally important. It can be difficult to love someone and observe that person making choices you don't love. You may be tempted to avoid contact and drift apart. But staying away won't help. You might need to establish boundaries, but keeping communication lines open is a must.

#### 3. Stay realistic.

You may hold yourself to a standard of perfection that not even God could match. Parents may lament when their children leave the Faith and think they should have been better witnesses, better parents, or better Christians or Catholics. Even if you were perfect, your child or friend could still walk away. That's because we are imperfect. I still walk away. You still walk away. Through Christ, we return.

#### 2. Keep praying.

Come before the Lord regularly and intercede on the person's behalf. When God moves in people's lives, often someone has been praying or fasting for them to help lift them up before God. Keep communication lines open with the person *and* God.

#### 4. Realize this decision is part of someone's story.

We are unable to change someone else. But if the person is still alive, the story is not over. Hope remains eternal. God still works.
