

How can we get our children to hear Scripture?

Reading the Bible can be challenging, even for adults, but the key is to establish the habit of reading it in childhood. Today, Lisa Bromschwig offers strategies that set the stage for the Word to be heard and enjoyed from an early age.

It's Not Impossible

The Bible is God's love letter to us. Its captivating stories, worthwhile events, and interesting people will capture children's attention. Catholic parents understandably want their children to enjoy Scripture to learn about salvation and what it means to them. Rooted in Scripture, your children's faith will flourish. Their prayers will become more fruitful, they will be able to enter more deeply into the Mass, and they will be drawn to obey God's will.

The Power of a Story

Encouraging kids to engage with the Word of God can be challenging for parents. Children's energy levels can make it difficult for them to listen for long periods. However, using the power of storytelling can help capture their attention.

According to Donald Miller, "The average person spends thirty percent of their time daydreaming. But when you put them in a movie theater, they stop daydreaming for the next ninety minutes. The movie does the daydreaming for them."

When you use the power of a story—like those you will share with them in the Bible—their brains are wired to stop daydreaming and listen.

While getting kids to read Scripture can be challenging, do it! Reading Scripture to children frequently can provide them with a solid foundation rooted in the unchanging truth of God's Word, helping them navigate the world's competing messages.




