

Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

This is our last weekend celebrating the Christmas Season, and I thank all of our staff and volunteers who made our campus and liturgies beautiful expressions of joy!

This weekend is the celebration of the Baptism of Jesus, an event that propelled Jesus into the desert in preparation for his public ministry. We too, in baptism, are thrust into the world as witnesses and testifiers to the power of God, but we often feel overwhelmed and muted in our efforts to proclaim good things. STM is participating in a diocesan-wide initiative that begins next week with two small groups (one Thursday afternoons, and the other Thursday evenings) that will help us re-appreciate the gift of our faith, and equip us to better share it in our lives.

Isaiah 49 is a six week series - completed ahead of Lent - and while you can sign up at stmkc.com, our Evangelization and Discipleship Coordinator, Hayley, will be in the Narthex after all Masses this weekend to encourage parishioners to sign up. Thank you to those who have already registered, and to those open to hearing more about how God wants to activate their baptism in astounding ways!

Next weekend, Father Joseph Uecker, a member of the Precious Blood community, will be with us, as part of the Unbound Ministry. It has been seven years since the ministry was at STM, and many of our parishioners over the years have supported the ministry by financially "adopting" children or the elderly in one of 17 countries where they operate. Thank you for your welcome of Father Joseph, and to the priests who will be helping at STM this month while Father Pius is back in Uganda.



Why did Jesus have to be baptized?

The short answer is this, he did it for us. Jesus went down to the Jordan to be baptized by John not because he needed it, but because we do. This baptism of repentance was not incidental. It is part of the righteousness of God that Jesus came to accomplish. Jesus, in Jordan's waters, took on humanity's sin. Pope Benedict XVI wrote:

Jesus loaded the burden of all mankind's guilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down to the depths of the Jordan. He inaugurated his public activity by stepping into the place of sinners. His inaugural gesture is an anticipation of the Cross."

Jesus made it clear that his death and his life were for us.

From then on, Jesus does the work of the Cross. When we contemplate the Cross,

we may only think of Christ's Passion. While the Passion is important, Christ did not begin his work of salvation when he stood in front of Pilate. Jesus made it clear at the Jordan that not only is his death for us, but his life as well.

"To Do ... the Will of Him Who Sent Me"

All four Gospels agree that immediately after his baptism, the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus ... and something changed. Before the Jordan, Jesus was almost indistinguishable from the other carpenters of his time. Nobody thought there was anything remarkable about him. Before the Jordan, he did little worth writing about. But after the Jordan, his life was extraordinary. He baffled family members. People who knew him said, "Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary?" (Matthew 13:55). Jesus stated, "I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me" (John 6:38). At the Jordan, it seems the Holy Spirit began to lead Christ in a new way. Christ made himself reliant on the Spirit and went forth to do the Father's will ... for us.




