We are excited to introduce STREAM

(Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Art, and Math) and project-based learning, further enriching our educational offerings and fostering a holistic learning environment.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTVITIES

Students have the opportunity to engage in a variety of extracurricular activities, including choir, band, robotics, chess club, Lego club, craft club, art club, pop culture club, spelling bee, geography bee, basketball,



football, track, cross country, volleyball, Student Council, and a talent show.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The State of Missouri allows MO residents to direct some of their MO tax dollars to our diocesan Bright Futures Fund to provide MO Scholars scholarships to qualifying families. This year, 51 students at STM School benefit from this program, with each student receiving \$6,375 annually toward tuition. This weekend begins Catholic Schools Week, and we rejoice in the opportunity our community has, daily, to help our young become saints. Yearly we make investments to enhance and strengthen the learning environment of our school, and we welcome members of the parish to visit the school during this Sunday's Open House (10AM-Noon). Coffee and donuts will be in Flanagan Hall, as well as student ambassadors who will provide tours of our building.

Per custom, Catholic Schools Week concludes with our Annual Auction, held next Saturday, February 1st, in Flanagan Hall. Doors for "Denim & Diamonds" open at 6PM. Thank you to the Knights of Columbus who sponsored the annual free-throw competition at our gym this week. In addition, the Knights are promoting their video series - Into the Breach - a collection of five short videos, (14 minutes or less), that highlight the ways in which faith can be strengthened in our families. Our STM Vocations Committee has been working hard to plan upcoming events to spur our community into deepening support for religious vocations. Upcoming offerings include:

+ Next weekend, our Vocations Crucifixes will go out at each of the weekend Masses, inviting families to pray for religious vocations in our community. The crucifixes will be distributed at Masses for two consecutive weekends: February 1/2 and February 8/9. See the next column to sign up for a crucifix.

- + Next Sunday, February 1st, is the World Day for Consecrated Life. Parishioners are invited to spend time in Adoration on Sunday, and sign a postcard that we will send to one of the two religious orders who live and work in our Deanery: the Little Sisters of the Poor, who operate the Jeanne Jugan Center, and the Congregation of Mary Queen, whose grayhabit community attends our daily Masses, living nearby on Grandview Road.
- + The following week, Februaru 8-9th is "Called by Name Sunday," and we will invite parishioners to Adoration again, this time signing postcards for the seminarians currently studying for our diocese. We will also invite parishioners that week to identify men and women in our community whom you believe might have a calling to the priesthood or religious life, so that we can send them a note of encouragement.

Does prayer change God?


Prayer is an essential part of every Christian's life, but sometimes we are challenged about the reasons why we do it. What is it good for? This week, Fr. Mike Schmitz offers a light about the importance of praying always, regardless of the challenges.

Pray Always

We pray because Jesus told us to do it, and when Jesus tells us to do something, it's good for us to do as he asks because he only wants what is good for us. He tells us to pray always. Jesus tells us to go before the Father and ask, ask, ask. He tells us to be persistent in prayer.

Prayer doesn't change God, but it does something. Prayer changes things. Well, God changes things. So why does he need us to pray? For an answer, let's turn to Blaise Pascal of France, a Catholic, philosopher, mathematician, and physicist who lived in the 1600s. "In calling us to pray for one another, God has extended to us the dignity of becoming causes," Pascal said.

God could just do it—whatever "it" is. But he wants us to work with him. More than that, he is *calling* us to participate in his work. This calling, this invitation, is something we need to respond to in a positive way. C. S. Lewis reminds us that God needs us to act. For instance,



if we want to eat, we can't sit and expect the food to magically appear. God needs us to do what needs doing: shop, cook, eat.

We are actors who get to choose. We are agents who act on the world. We make decisions that mean something in the physical world and spiritually. Our prayers are united to God's goodness, and that makes a difference. God extends to us the dignity of being causes. So, prayer doesn't change God, but it does change things. And one thing it surely changes is us.






