

Thank you to the 22 parishioners who offered Holy Hours last Sunday for the two religious communities living and working in our area. They were appreciative of the postcards of prayers, and for the barbeque meals delivered by members of our STM Vocations Committee.

This weekend, Called by Name Sunday is being celebrated throughout the diocese. We ask parishioners to consider the names of young men and women in their lives who you believe might be called to the priesthood or religious life. Cards are available in the pews, and QR codes (in this bulletin, website and also in our pews) give us a chance to submit those names to the diocese.

For the weekend, we are asking parishioners to use our Sunday Adoration to pray for any of the 19 seminarians currently studying for the diocese. (See the cover of the bulletin for their names/faces.) As last week, simply sign a card located on the table in the main aisle during Adoration, and we will deliver. **Note:** Adoration **concludes at 5PM** this weekend (as there is a BIG game for the city Sunday evening)!

Thanks to the volunteers and benefactors who made our annual auction possible last weekend. While we're still waiting on final totals (and the payment of all expenses), we're happy to report that the evening netted over \$131K for our Fund-a-Need goal to provide a new playground for our school. Called by Name Sunday - February 8-9

This weekend, our diocese recognizes our first Called by Name Sunday. The Sunday readings center on the theme of vocation. Bishop Johnston invites everyone to consider the following:

- If discerning your life's vocation, be open to God's call to the priesthood or religious life. God's calling is a beautiful gift; be courageous and open to His call! Jesus came that we might have life and have it to the full - do not be afraid! If God is calling you to the priesthood or religious life, then nothing less will satisfy.
- Please think of the men and women you know and believe might have a calling to the priesthood or religious life. While God is the one who calls, he often uses our voices. Visit kcsjcatholic.org and click on "Get started," then on "Priestly Vocations." The bishop will then send a letter of encouragement.

May all of us listen to God's call and follow where He leads as we continue to build a culture of vocations in our diocese.

February Prayer Intentions

Pope Francis: Let us pray that the ecclesial community

might welcome the desires and doubts of those young people who feel a call to serve Christ's mission in the priesthood and religious life.

Bishop Johnston: Let us pray for those suffering from the effects of a stroke or other debilitating illness, that they find strength and encouragement to live in a deeper communion with Christ.

Hymn and Word - on this weekend's music

In this weekend's Gospel reading, Luke 5:1-11, the men whom Jesus would call to be apostles have fished all night and caught nothing until Jesus sends them out and "they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing." Peter's "astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him." And Jesus called to them, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."

In our gathering song, Holy, Holy, Holy, Peter's fear at witnessing Jesus divinity ("Depart from me, Lord")has matured to worship inspired by awe at the grandure, and - gratitude for the mercy - of God. The offertory hymn, *Here I Am Lord*, is our first response to the Gospel: offering ourselves by listening for God's call for us. The first communion song, Bread of Angels, takes us deeper into Jesus' gift of himself that empowers us to live his call. The second communion song, These Alone, is a response to the Gospel and the Eucharist. We resolve to make the most of what we have been given by focusing our attention on what is essential. As we prepare to go out to be fishers of people, the song, You Have *Called Us,* is an opportunity to encourage each other by adding our voices to the sound of a community of faith embracing God's call.

WHAT WE WERE MADE FOR

What do our hearts want the most?

What have you been made for? What would satisfy you deeply, to your core? Some days, a power nap or a good snack might seem to be enough. During our more ambitious moments, we may yearn for something bigger, maybe success or even greatness. But even the most enjoyable pleasures—a project well done or winning a championship—eventually fade, and another quest for more begins.

We are both satisfied too easily and insatiable. We tend to settle for little bits of satisfaction that are just enough to keep us at ease briefly. Yet we always hunger for more. The question remains: "What have we been made for?" Why do we long for more?

If Only

How frequently do we think, *If only … If only I had a different house, a different job, a different spouse. If only I had more money or recognition. If only I had more friends.* The list goes on. While anything might deliver a little satisfaction, everyone—even the rich and famous—are restless and aching because people have been created for something this world cannot offer. We have been made for heaven.

"What Do You Seek?"

In the Gospel of John, Jesus dispenses with small talk when he calls the first apostles. No icebreakers, no cocktail party introductions. He went right to the heart, asking, "What do you seek?" (John 1:38). In response, two disciples left everything behind to follow Jesus. They perceived in Jesus the answer to what they truly sought—God himself, in the flesh, the One through whom all things exist, the Living Bread come down from heaven, the Living Water, the Good Shepherd, the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Like us, they were made for him and destined to be with him in heaven forever.
