

# THE PASTOR'S PEN

Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

A number of updates on projects:

- + This week we picked out new shingles to be installed on the church. The re-shingling of the entire church comes after hail damage that has provided a perennial leak in our church during heavy rains. Access to the church will not be disrupted during this replacement, and workers will work around our liturgy schedule, BUT know that it might get noisy "up above" if you come to the church to pray during off hours. We've been waiting for the weather to improve to begin work, and expect this project to take up the majority of the Lenten Season.
- + The full \$100K was raised to install 35 smartboards in our classrooms, beginning over spring break. I am grateful for the donors who have enabled this major upgrade to our classroom capabilities!
- + Over \$360K was raised through this year's Auction activities, with \$140K of that earmarked for our Fund-a-Need project to build a new playground on campus. We are still pursuing donors to help us bring this project to completion.

Ash Wednesday Masses will be at 6:15am, 8:15am and 6pm. (A separate Mass for the STM School community will be held too.) We are also adding a Saturday morning 8:15 AM Mass & 7:15AM Confession time to all the Saturdays of Lent.

Among the Lenten activities beginning this week...

- + Friday Fish Frys and Stations of the Cross
- + 5 Weekly Small Groups Exploring Bishop Barron's Lenten Gospel Reflections
- + A Lenten Series on Forgiveness
- + \$20 for Lent, raising funds for two local ministries assisting pregnant mothers and those battling poverty

May we all allow the season to deepen our hunger for the life that the Lord desires for us.

P.S. A reminder that Daylight Savings Time begins next weekend (Mar 8-9). Clocks spring ahead one hour before going to bed next Saturday night.

P.P.S. As a secondary reminder:

**Ash Wednesday and Fridays of Lent:** Obligatory day of Abstinence from meat (Obligatory from age 14 onward).

**Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**: Obligatory Days of Fasting (obligatory for those aged 18 until age 59, meaning one full meal permitted, and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal).

# Who Are Some of the Saints We Celebrate in March?

E ach month, the Catholic Church celebrates the feast days of several saints, each with their unique significance and stories. As we prepare to enter the season of Lent, the saints give us important examples to follow. Their lives provide us with moments of reflection and inspiration as we honor them at Mass. These men and women offer believers opportunities for spiritual growth, communal fellowship, and gratitude. There are many feast days that every Catholic should know. Here is one who is on the calendar for Monday.

# **St. Katharine Drexel:** A Life of Service

FEAST DAY: MARCH 3

Katharine Drexel was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on November 26, 1858. Growing up in a devout Catholic family, Katharine had a strong sense of social responsibility and compassion for the less fortunate. Her parents modeled a life of service, regularly using the wealth they had accumulated to support various charitable causes. In 1887, during a trip to the Western United States with her family, Katharine noticed the poverty and deprivation experienced by Native Americans and African Americans. This experience deeply affected her and led her to dedicate her life to serving marginalized communities.

Katharine entered religious life and joined the Sisters of Mercy in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. She founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament with the approval of Pope Leo XIII. Katharine used her considerable inheritance to fund the establishment of schools, missions, and institutions for struggling communities across the United States. Among her most notable achievements was the founding of Xavier University of Louisiana in New Orleans, the first Catholic university in the United States for African Americans.


Katharine's dedication to serving others earned her widespread admiration and respect. She died in 1955 at the age of ninety-six. In 2000, St. John Paul II canonized St. Katharine Drexel, making her the second American-born saint.



## Over \$100K in Gifts for Technology Improvements




