




Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

This weekend begins the holiest week of the Christian year. I encourage all to participate in the events of holy week, especially the Triduum - Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil, in which we celebrate in visceral ways the touchpoints of our salvation. Those include: the establishment of the priesthood and the Eucharist, as well as the celebration of sacramental oils used for healing and strength (Holy Thursday); the victory of the cross, and the centrality of it in our Christian life (Good Friday); celebrating the light that the darkness cannot overcome, now on historical display in the resurrection of Jesus Christ and manifested in the lives of those baptized into His life (Easter Vigil). I hope you and your families are able to join Father Pius, Father Paul and I in these celebrations!

A reminder that there is a collection on Good Friday supporting Christians in the Holy Land. This collection not only helps sustain the sites of the Holy Land, but also the Christians - the "living stones" - who maintain witness in the very terrain where Jesus' life, death and resurrection occurred.

During the Easter Season, the STM Vocations Committee sponsors a traveling crucifix for families to take into their homes for a week. One crucifix will be given out at every weekend Mass throughout the Easter Season to a parishioner or family who will also bring up the gifts of bread and wine for the Mass. Participants are asked to pray during the week for an increase of vocations to the priesthood and religious life, especially among the faithful here at STM! Individuals can sign up online at stmkc.com.



We had a gathering for donors this week, displaying the 35 new Smartboards placed in our classrooms last month. (Teacher training is shown in the photo.) This is the first of several technology goals we have established for the next

few years, and I am grateful to those who continue to support our initiatives to invest in the needs of our campus. Beginning next weekend, Father Pius has been tasked by the diocese to help on Sundays at some of our Spanish speaking parishes, due to one of our priests returning to his home country. You'll likely see less of him on Sundays, through the Easter Season.

Holy Week at STM - Reminder on (Temporary) Liturgical Changes for Holy Week

As we prepare for Holy Week, the Church undergoes a number of signs to awaken our senses. Among them:

Votive Candles Removed Unlit votive candles from the St. Joseph and St. Mary devotional area have been removed. The remaining candles will be allowed to burn down ahead of the Triduum. A fresh batch of devotional candles will be back in place beginning on Easter.

Statuary is Covered This veiling anticipates the pall of sorrow that falls upon the faithful as our Savior nears his passion. Statues are covered until the Easter Vigil.

Tabernacle is Emptied Ahead of Holy Thursday, the tabernacle will remain empty and open, with no lit tabernacle candle. The tabernacle will remain empty until the end of the the Easter Vigil.

Holy Water Fonts Emptied Ahead of Holy Thursday, the holy water fonts remain dry, to be refilled at the Easter Vigil.

Reminder to Homebound Ministers of Holy Communion - Availability of the Eucharist Shifts During Holy Week - Because the tabernacle is emptied ahead of Holy Thursday Mass - and remains empty until the Easter Vigil - ministers of communion to the homebound might need to adjust their visits to the faithful to accommodate during Holy Week.

Lent for the Family

Palm Sunday (C)

Luke 19:28-40 Isaiah 50:4-7 Philippians 2:6-11 Luke 22:14—23:56 or 23:1-49

Dear Family:

Read the reflection about the anticipation of Holy Week and discuss the "Ponder and Pray" questions and prompts, thinking about how Our Lord is calling you to act. Then consider the challenges of the "Live It" section, have fun with the family activities, and dive into the visio divina prayer exercise.

The Agony and the Ecstasy of These Days

Holy Week is a journey suspended between sorrow and hope, when the weight of the Cross looms heavy, yet the promise of Resurrection whispers just beyond sight. We walk with Jesus as he enters Jerusalem to cries of "Hosanna," knowing these voices will soon shout, "Crucify him." We follow him into the Temple, where zeal consumes him and the tension with religious leaders escalates. We witness the intimacy of the Last Supper, where Judas slips into darkness, leaving an unsettling void. These days draw us into the reality of sacrifice, obedience, and redemption.

6 And he took bread, and when he had given thanks he broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body which is given for you. " Do this in remembrance of me.'

Imagine walking with Mary through these events. Picture the joy in her eyes as the crowd celebrates Jesus, but also the silent anguish she carries, knowing what lies ahead. Sit with her at the Cross on Good Friday. Her sorrow is tangible, yet her faith remains steadfast. "He will rise," she whispers with certainty. Now, on Holy Saturday, be with her as she waits in stillness by the sealed tomb. Feel the weight of absence and see the flicker of hope she guards deep within her heart.

This week asks us to hold grief and joy together, to trust that in the deepest darkness, light already is breaking through. Like Mary, affix your gaze on Christ. Let his Passion teach you about God's boundless love, and let the anticipation of Easter stir a renewed faith in you. The tomb is not the endhis Resurrection is coming.

Live It

This Holy Week, find a way to reflect intentionally on the duality of sorrow and joy. Each evening, light a candle as a reminder of Christ's light that shines in the darkness. Pray with Scripture or attend the services of the Triduum— Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. Consider journaling your thoughts, emotions, and prayers each day, asking Mary to guide you through the heaviness of the week toward the joy of the Resurrection.

Visio Divina

Take a moment to imagine Mary following behind Jesus as he enters the gates of Jerusalem. As she moves through the bustling crowd, she remains prayerful, observing everything with the quiet attentiveness of a mother's heart. What might it have felt like to walk in her sandals, witnessing the joyful praise for her son, knowing the difficult path that still lay ahead? As you enter into this meditation, ask the Holy Spirit to stir your heart and help you see through Mary's eyes.

Question 1:

What stands out to you about Mary's posture and expression as she walks behind Jesus? What might her gaze reveal about what she's feeling or thinking?

Question 2:

Focus on the people following behind Mary. What do you imagine they think and feel as they walk this path?


Question 3:

What emotions do you think Mary experienced as she watched the crowd praise Jesus, knowing full well of his suffering to come?

Divine Mercy Novena begins Good Friday (April 18, 2025)

To prepare for the Feast of Divine Mercy,

the Lord asked Saint Faustina to make a novena (nine days) of prayer from Good Friday to the following Saturday. Jesus said, "By this novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary, 796). Jesus instructed Saint Faustina to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and bring to His Heart a different group of souls each day that He dictated to her. Jesus said: "I desire that during these nine days, you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death. On each day you will bring to My heart a different group of souls, and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy" (Diary, 1209).

Note:

Divine Mercy cards may be found in the narthex.

Instructions for the Novena (Diary, 1209)

STEP 1: Read the intention for the day, listed below.

STEP 2: Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy for the intention.

Intentions

DAY 1: Today, bring to Me all mankind, especially all sinners.

DAY 2: Today, bring to Me the souls of priests and religious.

DAY 3: Today, bring to Me all devout and faithful souls.

DAY 4: Today, bring to Me the pagans (those who do not believe in God) and those who do not yet know Me.

DAY 5: Today, bring to Me the souls of heretics and schismatics (the souls of those who have separated themselves from My Church).

DAY 6: Today, bring to Me the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children.

DAY 7: Today, bring to Me the souls who especially venerate and glorify My mercy.

DAY 8: Today, bring to Me the souls who are in the prison of Purgatory.

DAY 9: Today, bring to Me the souls who have become lukewarm.

How to Dray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy

BEGIN with one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Apostle's Creed.

OPTIONAL OPENING PRAYERS

- "You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls and the
 ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out
 upon us" (Diary, 1319).
- "O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!" (Diary, 84).

ON THE OUR FATHER BEADS, PRAY: "Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world" (Diary, 475).

ON THE HAIL MARY BEADS, PRAY: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world" (Diary, 475).

AFTER FIVE DECADES, pray the concluding doxology three times: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

OPTIONAL CLOSING PRAYER: Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion--inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is love and mercy itself.
