Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

This weekend is First Communion weekend, and we joyfully gather with students from STM School and our School of Religion. A word of thanks to Susan Duerr who oversees our SOR ministry; to Julie Anwander, Noelle Gallic & Gina Spiller, who teach our second grade students; and to our parents who ran this year's Jesus Day, preparing communicants for their encounter with Jesus.

Our 8th graders will celebrate their final days at the school this week, culminating in their Graduation Ceremony this Thursday evening. Please join me in congratulating them, and praying for their transition to high school. We will gather with the majority of them again in just a month, as they celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation.

This past week, we concluded our latest offering of Living Waters, our 20 week ministry that connects Jesus' mercy with the sexual and relational brokenness that every man and woman experiences. I was a small group leader of a band of men for this offering, and was grateful to accompany men in their 20s through 50s, who sought strength and healing for the sake of the people in their lives - spouses, children, parents - who benefitted from their growth. I am also overjoyed at the 50 guests - spouses, siblings, roommates, pastors - who gathered for our final night to hear first-hand testimony on how Jesus ministered to their loved ones this spring. This is one of the most impactful offerings afforded us at STM, and I do hope more consider it for themselves in the future.

Lastly, the Conclave begins this Wednesday for the election of a new Pope. Our 8:15am School Mass that day will use the Mass "For the Election of a Pope" as we join the faithful throughout the world in prayerful expectancy.


