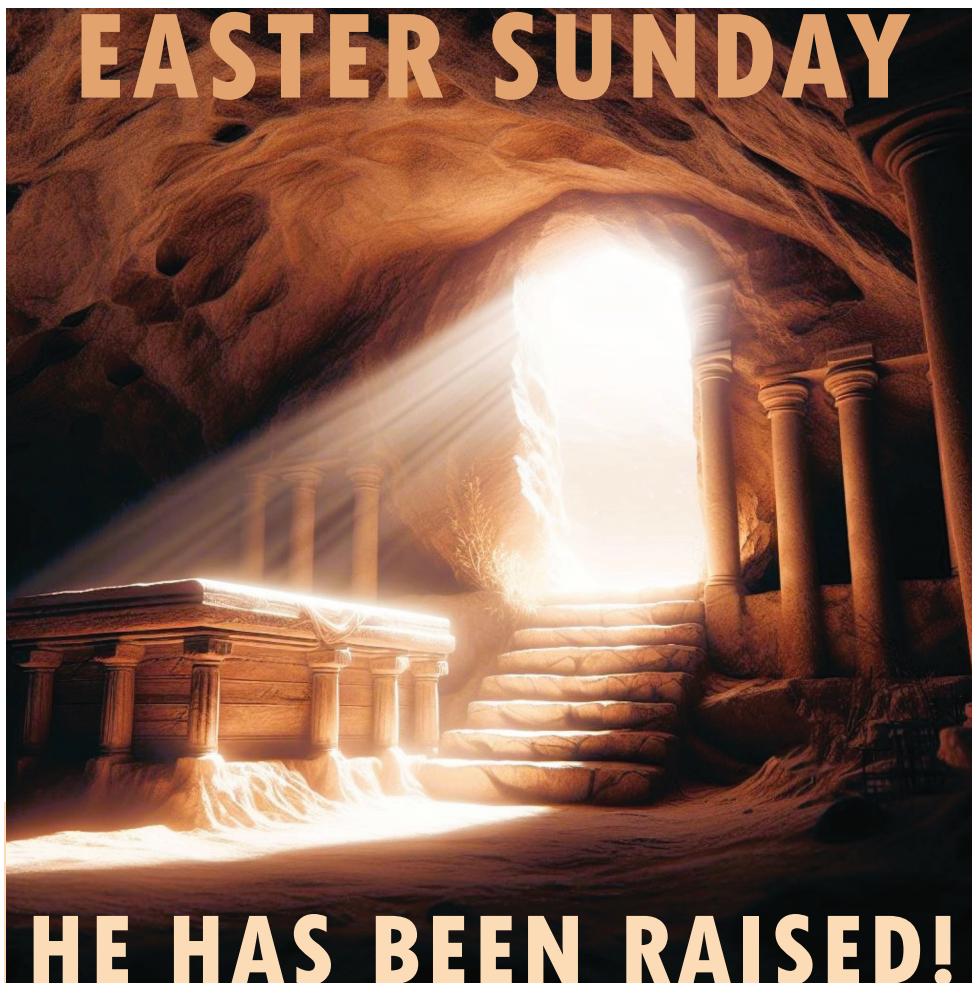

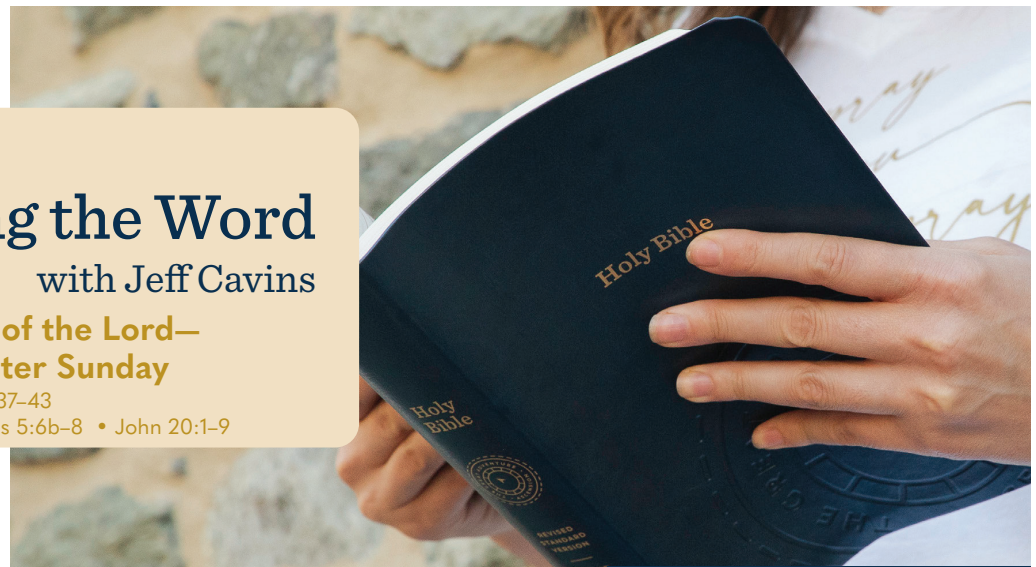

The Resurrection of the Lord— The Mass of Easter Sunday

Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Colossians 3:1-4 or 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8 • John 20:1-9



Raised With Christ

Alleluia! Christ is risen! The long journey through Lent and the sorrow of the Passion now bursts forth into joy: Death has been defeated, the grave overcome, and eternal life opened to all who believe. The Resurrection is not only the crowning truth of our faith, but the very event that changes everything for us.

St. Paul reminds us that, in Baptism, we have been united to Christ's death and resurrection. We have died with him, and now our lives are hidden with him in God. This means our focus shifts so that we no longer set our hearts on earthly pursuits alone, but on the things of heaven. Our treasure, our destiny, and our hope are not in this world but in the life to come, where we will share forever in the glory of Christ. This holds great consolation for us.

Yet Easter is not just about the future. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead has been and is being poured into our hearts. By the power of the Resurrection, we are already being transformed. And so we have to change our focus—our priorities, our choices, and our way of life must reflect this new reality. Every decision, every relationship, every moment is now marked by eternity. We are called to build his Kingdom, to live with heaven in view while carrying the light of the risen Christ into the world around us.

Living the Gospel

Easter proclaims that Christ is truly risen and that we are raised with him. Live this week with a Resurrection mindset. Refuse to let sin, despair, or fear have the final word. Let your words and actions reflect the hope of heaven. Practice charity, mercy, and forgiveness with renewed strength, knowing that the Spirit who conquered death empowers you to love. Carry the light of Christ into your family, your parish, and your community so that through you, others may encounter the power of the Resurrection.

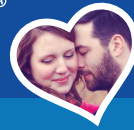
