Earth Day 2026

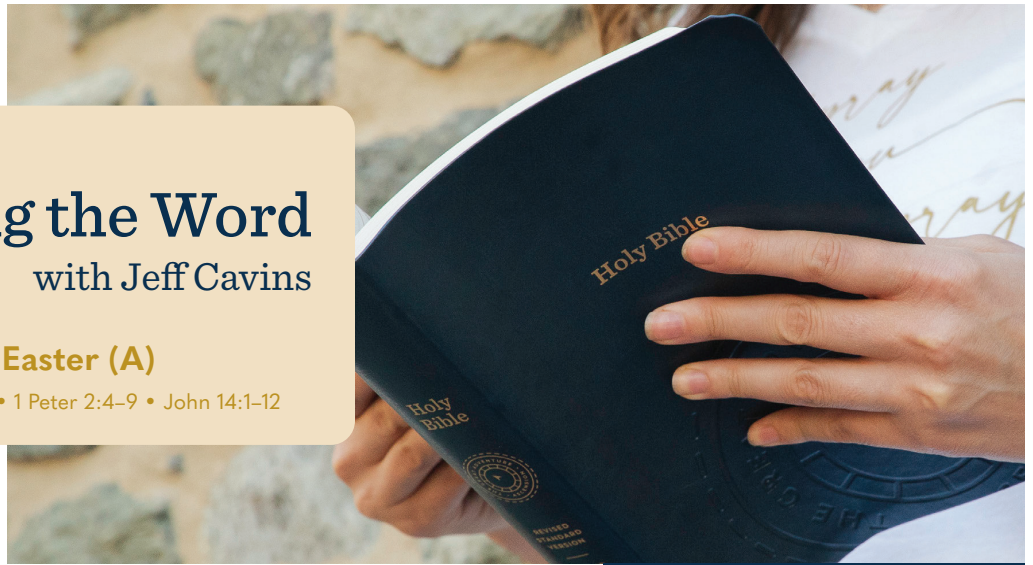

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Fifth Sunday of Easter (A)

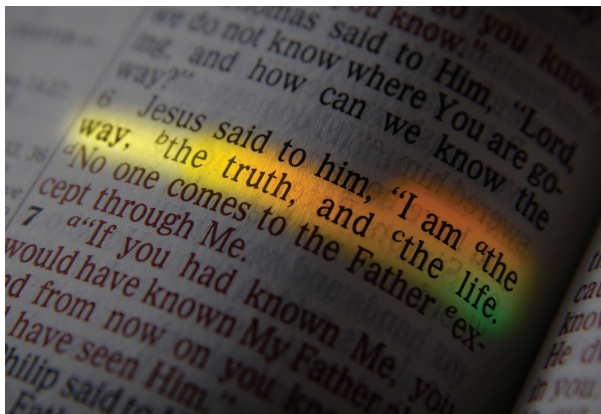
Acts 6:1-7 • Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19 • 1 Peter 2:4-9 • John 14:1-12



Revealing the Father

In today's Gospel, two disciples bring their deep questions to Jesus. Thomas asks, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus responds with words that echo through history: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father, except through me" (John 14:5-6). Christ himself is the path that leads us home, the truth that anchors us, and the life that gives us hope.

Then Philip pleads, "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us" (John 14:8). Jesus replies that to see him is to see the Father. Every word he speaks and every action he takes reveal the Father's love. To know Jesus, then, is to know God, not as a distant or unknowable deity, but as a Father who desires our trust and intimacy.



This revelation changes everything. If Christ has shown us the Father, then our lives must reflect this truth as well. Just as Jesus' words and deeds revealed the Father, so too we are called to live in such a way that others encounter God through us. Our daily actions, words, and choices become signs pointing to the Father's love.

The readings remind us that this mission belongs to the whole Church. We are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own" (1 Peter 2:9), entrusted with proclaiming God's marvelous light. The Acts of the Apostles shows how the early Church grew in faith and service, each member contributing to the work of God. In the same way, we are called to embody Christ so that others may come to know the heart of the Father through us.

Living the Gospel

Christ calls us not only to believe in him but also to make him visible to others. This week, take time to examine what your life reveals. Do your words bring encouragement? Do your actions reflect compassion? Do your habits point toward heaven? Choose one area of your life where you can more intentionally reveal the Father's love through gentleness, honesty, and service. By imitating Christ, your life can become a living message of the Gospel.

» Thomas longed for certainty about the way forward. Where in your life do you feel uncertain, restless, or afraid? How do you think entrusting yourself more fully to Christ as the way, the truth, and the life brings you peace and clarity?

» Philip desired to see the Father, but did not realize he was already present in Jesus. How often do you overlook the presence of God in your daily life? Do you recognize him in prayer, in the sacraments, or in the people around you? What would help you to recognize him more clearly?

This month we conclude our journey through with the 9th & 10th Commandments.

God warns us about coveting to help us avoid acting on the negative emotions of covetousness. When we covet, we compare ourselves and the blessings of our lives with that of others. Comparing fosters jealousy and ill-will toward others that often provokes one to harm others, either with words or with our actions.

The object of covetousness might be something tangible such as cars, clothes, and money. Or it can be something intangible such as prestige, pleasure, friendships, or success.

Over the next week, be attentive to how covetousness may have found a comfortable place in your heart. Then, consider some practical, healthy, and holy ways to replace that covetousness with authentic love, compassion, and friendship.

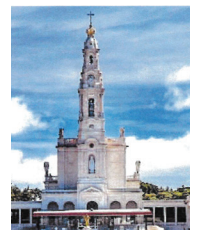
