Thomas More that put our faith into action by serving our brothers and sisters in need. We are looking for creative and energetic people to join our committee to continue our important work.

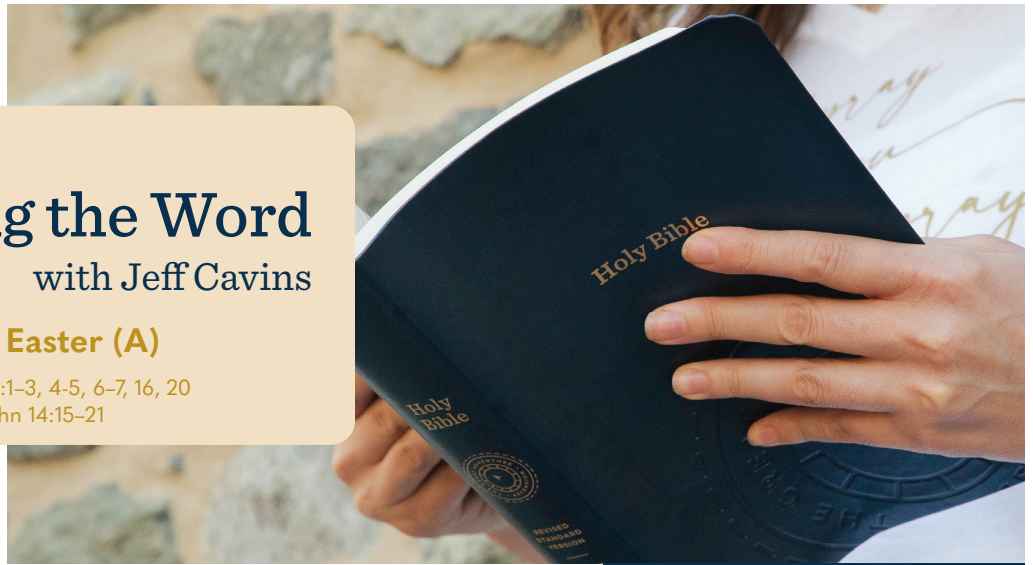

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Sixth Sunday of Easter (A)

Acts 8:5–8, 14–17 • Psalm 66:1–3, 4–5, 6–7, 16, 20
1 Peter 3:15–18 • John 14:15–21



Obedient Love

In today's Gospel, Jesus poses a question that pierces the heart: Do you love me? Many of us would respond immediately, "Of course I do!" Yet Jesus gives us the true test of love: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). Love for Christ is not only expressed in words or feelings but also in obedience. Love is expressed in choosing to live according to his will.

At first, this command might seem overwhelming. Who among us keeps Christ's commandments perfectly? But Jesus does not leave us to struggle alone. He promises to send the Holy Spirit, the Counselor and Spirit of Truth, to dwell within us and guide us. The Spirit is our Advocate, our Helper, the One who strengthens us to live out what Christ asks. We are not left as orphans, abandoned to our weakness. Instead, we are adopted as beloved children of God, accompanied by the Spirit who gives us the courage to obey.

This obedience is not servile but born of love. Just as Christ reveals the Father through his words and actions, so our obedience reveals our love for Christ. The more we follow him in daily life, the more he reveals himself to us. Obedience opens the door to intimacy; to love Christ is to trust him enough to live as he teaches, confident that the Spirit empowers us to do so.



Living the Gospel

To love Jesus is to obey him. This week, choose one specific command of Christ, such as forgiving an enemy, serving the poor, or keeping Sunday holy, and resolve to live it out faithfully as an act of love. Call upon the Holy Spirit to strengthen you in this act of obedience. As you do, look for and expect Christ to reveal himself more deeply, for he promises to make himself known in the lives of those who love him through action.

Commandments of the Month: 9th & 10th

"You shall not covet your neighbor's wife."

"You shall not covet your neighbor's goods."

This month we conclude our journey through with the 9th & 10th Commandments.

Covetousness is a condition of the heart that provokes words and actions that harm others and damage relationships. Healthy desires are made possible by God's desire for us to live fulfilling lives and to serve one another. Coveting is when our desires become disordered, focused on pleasing or promoting oneself at the detriment of others.

The symptoms of coveting include jealousy, lust, discontentment, being sad at the good fortunes of others or being happy about their bad fortunes. Being aware of these symptoms gives us the opportunity to examine why our feelings are disordered, and then take corrective steps to reorder our desires by replacing selfishness with gratitude, generosity, and genuine concern for others.



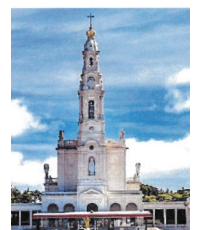
